## Grab a Friend and Plant a Tree with the Port



As part of the Port's [greenhouse gas mitigation grant program](#), we have committed nearly \$700,000 to provide funding for 6,000 trees to be planted in Long Beach neighborhoods through 2020. The trees are planted by various volunteers from the community and by local businesses and community groups in partnership with the City's Neighborhood Services department.

The next tree planting will take place on Saturday, May 30 at Cesar E. Chavez Park and this one is a special one — the 2,000th tree made possible by the grant will be planted! Gather your friends and family to join us for this fun event. The Port will provide free hats and water for all volunteers.

## New Bridge, New Icon



The Gerald Desmond Bridge has been in the city of Long Beach since 1968, but with bigger ships coming through our Port, it is time for a replacement.

Crews have already constructed 148 foundation piles and foundations for the two 515-foot towers are underway for the replacement bridge. Once complete, the towers for the new bridge will be the tallest structure in Long Beach! The new bridge will also have a clearance of 205 ft., allowing bigger ships to enter the north harbor area.

As more construction is completed, it will be much easier to envision the path and trajectory of the new bridge.

More fun facts about the new bridge:

- Once built, the new bridge will have the highest vertical clearance of any cable-stayed bridge in the U.S.
- The bridge will be supported by about 350 foundation piles, as deep as 175 feet below the surface
- There will be viewing decks and biking and pedestrian paths so that everyone can enjoy the view atop the bridge
