What does it take to begin a career in international trade? Students at Cabrillo High School are getting the answer to that question at the Port of Long Beach's Academy of Global Logistics.

The Port recently launched the four-year academy, opening a new pathway to careers in international trade for high school students in the city. The initiative, conducted in partnership with the Long Beach Unified School District, combines academic curriculum with industry-relevant training and information.

The Academy of Global Logistics at Cabrillo High School builds on the [Long Beach College Promise](#) by introducing high school students to career opportunities in global trade and logistics and showing them how to prepare for those careers through a wide range of training and education programs including certifications and degrees offered by Long Beach City College and California State University, Long Beach.

Female professionals from a variety of careers, from the trucking industry to the Coast Guard to terminal operations, all shared their own stories and tips for success.

The annual luncheon recognizes and celebrates the important role women play in the field of goods movement and aims to inspire young women in high school to pursue careers in this important industry.
