Testing Hydrogen and Electric Powered Terminal Equipment



The Port of Long Beach is continuing its commitment to being the greenest Port in the world by implementing cutting-edge zero-emissions equipment. A \$5.3 million grant from the California Air Resource Board will fund yet another Port zero-emissions project, dubbed the Commercialization of POLB Off-Road Technology Demonstration Project (C-PORT). Under C-PORT, both hydrogen and electric-powered cargo-handling equipment will be tested at two of our shipping terminals.

The demonstration project is part of [California Climate Investments](#), an initiative that invests funds generated from the state's cap-and-trade dollars into projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions, strengthen the economy and improve public health and the environment.

Information about the demonstration will be incorporated into the curriculum for the [Port of Long Beach Academy of Global Logistics \(AGL\) at Cabrillo High School](#) to support education and workforce development for new port technologies. The AGL program is a partnership with the Long Beach Unified School District that combines academic curriculum with industry-relevant training to support academic and career development.

New Standard for Clean Trucks



Launched in 2008, the Port of Long Beach's groundbreaking Clean Trucks Program implemented a phased ban on older, heavy-polluting diesel drayage trucks with engines that were made before 2007. When the Clean Trucks Program was fully implemented in 2012, port truck emissions had been reduced by more than 90 percent!

Given the success of the Clean Trucks initiative, both the Ports of Long Beach and Los Angeles have now implemented an even higher standard for trucks that visit marine terminals – all trucks driving in and out of both ports will have to be a 2014 model year or newer. The requirement takes effect Oct. 1 and applies only to trucks that are not currently registered in the Ports Drayage Truck Registry.

The coordinated effort between the two Ports is one of the many air quality measures implemented as part of the [San Pedro Bay Ports Clean Air Action Plan](#). Under the CAAP, both Ports are working toward transitioning to zero-emissions trucks by 2035.
