Green Port Fest '09 to Feature Local Performers Entertainment includes community-based dancers, bands, singers

What do a Long Beach-based Rock n' Roll band, a Cambodian dance troupe, a high school band and a folk singer have in common?

They will all perform at <u>Green Port Fest '09</u>, the annual open house hosted by the Port of Long Beach. The street festival is an opportunity for the public to get a behind-thescenes look at one of the busiest seaports in the world.

Green Port Fest '09 is free to the public and will take place from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on October 3, 2009, at the Port of Long Beach.

Between guided boat tours of the harbor, train rides and interactive exhibits, visitors also will have a chance to enjoy some Long Beach performers:

- * Blue Steel, a popular Rock n' Band that counts among its members some police officers.
- * Kristi Jo is a folk singer and a native of neighboring Orange County who performs frequently throughout Southern California.
- * "Spirit of Khmer Angkor" is a local Cambodian dance troupe whose intricate costumes and techniques are steeped in centuries of tradition.
- * Also scheduled to perform is the acclaimed Cabrillo High School Band.
