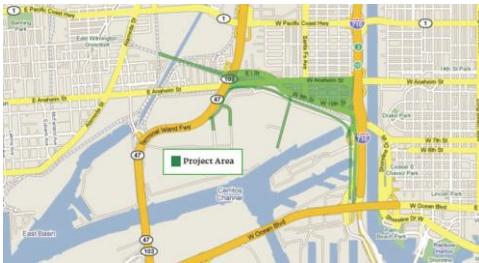

Hearing on Wednesday for Input on Rail Facility Issues to be reviewed in upcoming study of proposal

The Port of Long Beach will hold a second public hearing on Wednesday, September 16, to gather public input on a proposal for an On-Dock Rail Support Facility that would help increase the use of on-dock trains and reduce the need for as many local truck trips near the Port.

The hearing on Wednesday at 6 p.m. will be held at the Port Administration Building, 925 Harbor Plaza in Long Beach, in order to gather comments and suggestions on what issues should be examined in a comprehensive environmental study of the proposal.

The proposed On-Dock Rail Support Facility would potentially redevelop and expand an existing rail support facility in the vicinity of 9th Street and Pier B Avenue in the Port of Long Beach. Including new tracks, the new facility would stretch from the Alameda Corridor in the north end of the Harbor District to Ocean Boulevard at the Port.
