Board to Consider Huebner as New H.R. Director Candidate would oversee Port personnel policies, procedures

The Board of Harbor Commissioners on Monday, Aug. 2 will consider appointing Margaret A. Huebner as the Port's new Director of Human Resources.

Huebner would succeed Acting Director Stacey Lewis, who will resume her duties as assistant director. If appointed, Huebner would report to Steve Rubin, Managing Director of Finance and Administration.

The Director of Human Resources oversees the development, application and interpretation of personnel policies and procedures as they apply to the nearly 400 full-time Port employees. The Port's human resources division is responsible for managing employee compensation, benefits, special employee programs, training and development, recruiting and labor relations, among other functions.

Huebner is a 35-year veteran of the field with numerous accolades, including "Outstanding Achievement in Labor Relations" from the National Director of the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service, an independent agency of the United States Government that seeks to prevent or settle disputes between labor unions and management. She recently completed the "Mediation and Conflict Resolution" program at CSU, Northridge.

Huebner has worked for a wide variety of industries in her career, including the maritime industry, government contracting, and defense manufacturing. Most recently, she spent nearly ten years in the Middle East in the practice of HR.

She has a Master of Science degree in Human Resources Design from Claremont Graduate University and holds the professional designation of Senior Professional in Human Resources certification from the Human Resource Certification Institute.

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
