



Port to Prepare Impact Study on Cement Facility Project Public 'scoping' meeting September 14 to seek input

The Port of Long Beach has begun preparing an environmental impact report on a proposal to modify the existing Mitsubishi Cement Corp. import cement terminal on the Port's Pier F by constructing additional cement storage silos and truck loading equipment and upgrading ship unloading equipment and other landside structures.

An initial public meeting, known as a "scoping" meeting, will be held September 14 at 6 p.m. at Long Beach City Hall to seek input on issues that should be addressed in the environmental report.
